

## 'EMPOWERING THE FUTURE OF STUDENT IDENTIFICATION WITH A FOCUS ON ESSENTIAL REGULATIONS'

## The workshop will be hosted by the European Campus Card Association and will focus on the following:

- The adoption of the eIDAS regulation in 2014 allowed notified national electronic identification schemes (eIDs) to be used to access public services online across borders. As our digital landscape continues to evolve, the introduction of eIDAS 2.0 will embrace new types of electronic trust services, that will enable every European to have digital identity credentials that are recognised across the EU.
- The EU Digital Identity Wallets (EUDIW) will provide a safe, reliable, and private means of digital identification
  for everyone in Europe. Every Member State will provide at least one version of the wallet by 2026 to all its
  citizens, residents, and businesses allowing them to prove who they are, and safely store, share and sign
  important digital documents.
- The NIS2 Directive is the EU-wide legislation on cybersecurity. It provides legal measures to boost the overall level of cybersecurity in the EU. We will discuss what this directive means for your organization and how to protect your university with a focus on student identification.
- The workshop discussions will explore the history, significance and impact of these regulations on digital trust and security.
- It will delve into the practicalities of these regulations for HEIs and outline the steps being taken regarding the issuing of mobile credentials.
- The workshop will conclude with an open discussion and Q&A session.
